

General Membership Meeting November 9, 2014

The meeting was called to order by President Alan Dexter at 3:00 p.m. noting a quorum was present. There were no additions to the agenda.

Secretary Karen Staker read the minutes from the March 10, 2014 meeting. John Young moved and Dean Whited seconded the motion to approve as read. Motion carried.

Treasurer Carol Tyra presented the current receipts and expenditures. Aluminum cans have been sold but that was not recorded in this month's receipts. She reported 86 members plus 7 who were prepaid with their February 1 dues. Janyne Hoff moved and Louise Quayle seconded the motion to approve the report. Motion carried.

Second Vice President Marianne Muzio reminded everyone to thank the aluminum can recycling committee members for all their work during the season. She also reminded everyone to sign up for the following Saturday's fun tournament. The only cost is \$5 per person to eat lunch.

Second Vice President Laverne Johnson reported there will be two fun tournaments, one invitational with the Resort with Silveridge as host, and one invitational with Sunland Village with Silveridge hosting that also. Management has stated Courts 3 and 4 will be repaired or refinished next year. Because maintenance has been so helpful and cooperative, if any member sees something needs to be done, please contact either Laverne or Claude Dalcourt so they can talk with maintenance. Do not try to tell the maintenance workers what to do. Also Laverne reminded everyone to check the bulletin board often for pertinent information.

President Alan thanked all members who have volunteered for kitchen work and cleaning the courts.

East Valley representative Tom Mainers reported on a recent East Valley meeting. He stated two teams are borrowing non-4.0 players on a trial basis for this year only. Because it is a trial, it will be voted on this spring at the close of the season. Because there are so few 1.5 players this fall, all 1.5 players are getting together on Thursdays with different parks serving as the host. Silveridge will be the host on December 4. Tom also reported five of the seven Silveridge teams won last week, marking a good beginning.

There was no Rating Committee report.

Property Manager Claude Dalcourt voiced a thank you to Laverne Johnson for all his summer work on the kitchen and also for putting up the nets and screens. Court 3 still has some repair needed. Claude will prioritize the many things that still need done so everyone needs to remain patient. Captains need to monitor the use of the blowers so that the wrong gas is not used in them. They are locked for safe use. Five movable cupboards are now in the kitchen with casters on the bottom for easy moving. Claude will be asking for volunteers to move them in a hurry should heavy rain occur during the season. They will be moved for the summer. Two permanent countertops will be placed above the cupboards. Claude will be requesting financial help through the Renters' Association. Claude and Tom Mainers both reminded everyone to join the Renters' Association. Claude thanked Tom Mainers, Gail Young, Louise Quayle, Rhona Davies, Peter Johnson, and Barry Wakeford for all their help with the kitchen work.

Hans Homfeldt asked about seating on the west side of Court 2. There is no walk way to get there, but chairs are being placed in the rocks. Could concrete be placed there instead of the rocks? That request will be forwarded to management.

There was no Website Committee report.

Recruiting Chairperson Yvonne Lindley reported Peter Johnson and Eileen Tommervik will give presentations at the Thursday morning coffee to encourage people to consider joining the club. Yvonne will be working on mass mailings and contacts at afternoon all-play. She has contacted Activity Director Sue about a day for all clubs to set up booths in the ballroom so that all residents could attend. More information will follow.

Fundraising Chairperson Fran Dexter reported Eileen Tommervik and Wenda Taylor are also on the committee. One hundred fifty books have been delivered and it is hoped to sell them all. The club will receive 50% for all books if at least 50 are sold. Approximately thirty have already been sold. Several members in different areas of the park will have books in addition to the Activity Office and after Thursday morning coffee.

President Alan asked if there were any questions or comments concerning the proposed changes to the constitution or by-laws. There were none and changes were approved with a unanimous vote.

Gail Young is chairing the committee to observe the Silveridge Tennis Club's twenty-fifth anniversary. Different options presented include a banner to hang, T-shirts with tennis logo, a sign on the sandwich board, a skit, and former members' pictures displayed. So far Tom Mainers and Cletus and Rosemary Franta are working with Gail. If anyone has an idea, see Gail.

Karen Staker stated she has been working on making the bulletin board organized and more attractive. She asked that members do not stick something up without checking on its placement.
